Highlights



- Fleet Championship relatively unchanged
- Including some of our longer blue-ribbon races as part of our Championship Series Fitzroy Bay and Island Bay 1.
- Championship racing pre-Christmas will be mid-long harbour races, with starts from either RPNYC or Pt Jerningham.
- Summer Series will be shorter sprint races as the fleet prepares for the RPNYC Regatta.
- Autumn Series will revert to harbour courses.
- Summer two-handed is on selected Championship race days.
- Rum Racing comprises individual races only with no overall series.
- The Women's Helm series is the only series within our Rum Races.
- Reintroduce a Mark Foy start for Island Bay 2.
- Offshore programme includes Akaroa race 6th Feb. Special entry required.
- Introduction of 2 'special' race days. These could be destination races and raft-ups, or other fun formats.

Gin/Cruising Series



- Designed for those boats/skippers wanting to progress from Rum Racing – or just enjoy the more relaxed style of 'racing'.
- Raced on championship race days across the season
- One long harbour race per day 2 3 hours
- Race courses designed to build confidence and crew work and easily sailed with white sails if you wish.

Reminder – cut-off times and recording finis

• 18.4

Any boat that finishes after the **cut-off times** of 2100 hours for rum and twilight races, 17:00 for winter series races, or 1800 hours for all other races will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

• 18.5

Boats may be requested to record their own finish time if finishing within 60 minutes of the **cut-off times** specified in SI 18.3 and shall communicate their finish time to the Race Committee via the appropriate WhatsApp channel within 60 minutes of finishing the course. The request to record finishing times will be communicated to the fleet as per SI 3.2. Any boat failing to record and report their finish time within the stated time will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.














- Not all flags that we use are in the SIs, make sure you know the RRS flags

RPNYC Specific Flags




RPNYC Specific Flags

Pre-race SI 9.3





PART 1

FUNDAMENTAL RULES

1 SAFETY

1.1 Helping Those in Danger

A boat, competitor or *support person* shall give all possible help to any person or vessel in danger.

1.2 Life-Saving Equipment and Personal Flotation Devices

A boat shall carry adequate life-saving equipment for all persons on board, including one item ready for immediate use, unless her class rules make some other provision. Each competitor is individually responsible for wearing a personal flotation device adequate for the conditions.





ACCEPTANCE OF THE RULES

- (a) By participating or intending to participate in an event conducted under the *rules*, each competitor and boat owner agrees to accept the *rules*.
- (b) A support person by providing support, or a parent or guardian by permitting their child to enter an event, agrees to accept the rules.

Each competitor and boat owner agrees, on behalf of their *support persons*, that such *support persons* are bound by the *rules*.

Acceptance of the rules includes agreement

- (a) to be governed by the *rules*;
- (b) to accept the penalties imposed and other action taken under the rules, subject to the appeal and review procedures provided in them, as the final determination of any matter arising under the rules;
- (c) with respect to any such determination, not to resort to any court of law or tribunal not provided for in the *rules*; and
- (d) by each competitor and boat owner to ensure that their support persons are aware of the rules.

The person in charge of each boat shall ensure that all competitors in the crew and the boat's owner are aware of their responsibilities under this rule.

This rule may be changed by a prescription of the national authority of the venue.

Fundamental Rule 4



DECISION TO RACE

The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue *racing* is hers alone.

Safety

- Boats complete their own category 5 check before 1st race
- Checks to be conducted on boats by boats during the year
- Upload the completed checklist to SailSys
- Boats that do not comply with Safety and Membership Regulations may be protested by the Race Committee

"2.01 The safety of a vessel and her crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the skipper who must do their best to ensure that the vessel is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by an experienced crew who are physically fit to face bad weather."


